## **BIOBANKS FUEL MEDICAL RESEARCH**

Advances in medical research have drastically improved quality of life for millions of people and led to effective treatments for conditions that were once life-threatening.

In order to continue improving treatments and therapies, researchers need access to health information and biological samples, such as blood, from a wide variety of people. A biobank is a collection of deidentified information and samples that scientists can access for their research.

A single biospecimen from one patient has the ability to fuel numerous research projects, any one of which might lead to an important medical breakthrough.

BC Children's Hospital BioBank collects samples from children at BC Children's Hospital and from pregnant women at BC Women's Hospital. Development of the BC Children's Hospital BioBank was made possible by a donation from Mining for Miracles - the BC mining community's longstanding fundraising campaign for BC Children's Hospital.

#### PUBLIC OPINIONS OF THE BIOBANK

In the past year, surveys were distributed at various high schools in the Vancouver School Board district to gain an understanding of how the public perceive biobanks. We compared the opinions of the public in a hospital setting versus a school setting. Overall, it was discovered that those who were in a hospital setting are more likely to donate samples to a biobank. What was equally interesting was that the results showed that adolescents are more willing to donate their leftover biospecimens than their parents.
